Our Goals

The Intercultural Parents Network fosters connections and exchange among parents with a migration background.

We create spaces where parents can support each other and jointly advance their concerns.

A key focus is promoting participation, educational equity, and social inclusion. We raise awareness of the challenges families with a migration background face in the education system and empower parents to know their rights and actively engage.

Our goal is to empower parents and build a strong advocacy group.

By connecting with existing networks, we avoid parallel structures and make effective use of resources.

The **target group** of the Intercultural Parents Network includes all parents with a migration background and migrant parent communities.

We also seek **collaboration** with committed stakeholders from parent initiatives, educational institutions, migrant self-organizations, counseling centers, and social work.

How Our Network Is Structured

A volunteer steering committee gathers the needs of parents and actively incorporates them into the networks work.

A coordination office handles organization, communication, and moderation, and maintains exchange with external cooperation partners.

In thematic working groups, parents can share their experiences and perspectives and work together on specific topics.

Additionally, the network regularly organizes themed evenings, workshops, and events—on topics such as education, language, health, and more.

It also offers advice and support as well as opportunities to participate in committees and education policy processes.

Children with a migration background are often structurally disadvantaged in the education system—their chances of academic success are frequently lower than those of their classmates. At the same time, parents with a migration background are significantly underrepresented in school committees and parent councils.
